As I thought about this it occurred to me; how many people regard the message and promise of both Good Friday and Easter as being nothing more than a "joke". As St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians so long ago, "Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom but we preach Christ crucified."

And so it is with Good Friday and Easter; we either get it or we don't. Easter Sunday falls on April Fool's Day this year and Easter, all about God's love for all of us as revealed through Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, is most certainly not a joke.
